indicates there is promise in their theory. So, without our "Career Starter" grants, many researchers would never be able to begin the scientific process to get their ideas off the ground so to speak. So, the KTEF is very critical and much appreciated. So, my Fraters, we have always done well in our contributions to the KTEF. Let us, with this knowledge, continue to push and generously support this charity so that we, like Christ, our Lord, may give sight to the blind.

September is here, as noted, and once again, we will be busy. Take notice of this month's events. We will visit District 4 on the 13th where they will confer the Order of Malta. Of course, this sets up the opportunity for us to visit District 3 on October 11th where we will welcome some really fortunate new SKs to the Valiant and Magnanimous Order of the Temple at the George Washington Memorial Shrine. We have the Mid Atlantic Conference the weekend of 26 and 27 September where I and other members of our staff will report our accomplishments and make the other Grand Commanderies of our Department wish that they too were members of the Grand Commandery of Virginia ©.
